Your child will need a writing utensil and paper. If wanted you can write a letter using cursive writing as well.
			This website will allow your child to create books online. If you wish to save their work, you'll need to sign up for an account. In 4th grade, students work on how to structure complete sentences into paragraphs that make sense, with main ideas and details. Your child should be able to successfully use transition words and provide meaningful content in their writing. Your child may choose to write fictional stories or even research a topic to create a nonfiction book. If you prefer a paper/pencil method have your child journal or do similar stories in a notebook.
