Students must follow these steps for a college visit to count as an excused absence:

- 1) Contact the post-secondary institution to arrange an official campus visit.
- 2) Complete "Section I" of this form 2 days prior to the campus visit.
- 3) Communicate with every teacher whose class you will miss regarding makeup work, and have those teachers initial the appropriate block below.
- 4) Complete "Section II" of this form during the campus visit.
- 5) Turn in this completed form to the high school office the first day you return to school.

Checklist for a Campus Visit

- Meet with an admissions counselor.
- Verify admission requirements (tests required and high school preparation).
- Discuss your chances for success in certain programs of study.
- Find out how to apply. Do they prefer online application submission or hard copies?
- Request a viewbook and other publications.
- Meet with a financial aid representative. Determine the total cost of attendance.
- Ask about financial aid opportunities, as well as deadlines, forms required, etc.
- Meet with faculty in the department of your intended major.
- What is the student/teacher ratio? How many people will likely be in my freshmen level classes?
- What percentage of students are international students? Are there opportunities for study abroad? If so, how are these opportunities accessed?
- Attend a class to get an idea of typical size, teaching style, and academic atmosphere.
- Eat a meal in the student union. Familiarize yourself with the meal/food options available.
- Ask about the job placement records and percentages for graduates in the field you might study.
- Tour the campus (be sure to check out the residence halls, library, computer labs, etc.).
- Talk to students about the general academic environment and the amount and kind of study necessary for success.
- Find out what student activities (clubs, organizations, intramurals, etc.) are available.
- What are the freshmen housing policies? Are all freshmen required to live on campus? How are roommates matched?
- What percent of the student body is Greek (in Fraternities & Sororities)?
- What do students do on the weekend?
- Is there a freshmen orientation program? If so, what will it be like?
- What health/medical facilities are available on campus? Where is it located? What is the cost for a typical visit?
