

### Engineering Scholarships Available to Graduating High School Seniors

The funding for the scholarships described herein is provided by the Missouri Society of Professional Engineers – Southwest Chapter(MSPE-SW).

These scholarships are provided for graduating high school seniors who have a genuine interest in engineering. Please read the instructions carefully and fulfill all of the requirements. Should you have questions that your parent, guidance counselor or principal cannot answer, please contact the Chapter Scholarship Committee Chair listed on Page A-6

#### Goal of the MSPE-SW Chapter Scholarship Program

- To provide scholarships in one or more engineering schools approved by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) or one of the transfer programs for worthy and qualified applicants and otherwise to provide financial assistance to the students, faculties, and administrations of such schools.
- To promote the study of engineering and research therein, the circulation of knowledge, and the continuing education of engineers by only charitable and educational means.

#### Eligibility Requirements for State and Chapter scholarships:

- 1) Be a high school senior for the 2022-2023 school year
- 2) Be a citizen of the United States at the time of application
- 3) Have at least a 3.0 grade point average (based on a 4.0 scale) for the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grades.
- 4) Have at least a minimum score on the American College Testing Program (ACT) test of 29 in Math and 25 in English.
- 5) Must enroll in an engineering program that has been accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET-EAC) or a Pre-Engineering Program at a College or University that has a working agreement to transfer credits with an ABET Accredited College or University.

#### Type of Scholarship

MSPE-SW will award scholarships in varying amounts. (The Southwest Chapter (Chapter 11) will award a minimum of one \$2000 scholarship for 2023. However, the Southwest Chapter reserves the right to award multiple/additional scholarships of varying amounts, as funds allow.) These scholarships are awarded to high school seniors preparing to attend an engineering school or program as described above.

#### Note to Applicant

Deadline for submittal to Chapter Scholarship Committee Chair is July 31, 2023.

The announcement of the winner(s) will be made on or before August 10. Scholarship awards are contingent upon enrollment in engineering and being accepted by the college or university.

The Missouri Society of Professional Engineers – Southwest Chapter will award a minimum of one (1) \$2000 scholarship to a high school senior. To be eligible, this student must enroll in an engineering program that has been accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET-EAC) or a Pre-Engineering Program at a University that has a working agreement to transfer credits to an ABET Accredited School. The top-scoring candidate will be awarded a scholarship. The scholarship is awarded after enrollment verification in the fall semester.

To be eligible, a student should submit the following to his/her Chapter Scholarship Committee Chair (see page A-6). Deadline for submittal is **July 31, 2023**:

- 1) Application
- 2) Official Transcripts (must be in sealed envelope) and ACT scores (Minimum scores Math: 29, English 25; attach official score sheet)
- 3) Recommendation of teachers (at least two)
- 4) Essay on career plans (maximum 300 words)
- 5) School picture in envelope labeled with applicant's name (to be used for publication in local media if selected as award recipient).

Mail application and materials to your Chapter Scholarship Committee Chair (determined by the county in which you reside, see page A-6) no later than **July 31, 2023**.

The following criteria will be used by MSPE as the basis for selecting scholarship winners:

ACT Scores	20 points	
Applicant's volunteer activities, work experience, honors/scholarships	20 points	
Recommendation of at least two teachers	10 points	
Essay on career plans (maximum 300 words)	20 points

The essay should discuss your interest in engineering, your major area of study and area of specialization, the occupation you propose to pursue after graduation, your long-term goals and how you hope to achieve them. The essay may also include any other information that is relevant to your career plans. The essay should be a typewritten or computer-printed essay of no more than 300 words, double-spaced. Your essay should contain a clearly stated objective, have clarity of expression and logical consistency, and should be free from errors. Put your name and major field of engineering at the top of the page.


