There will be one \$1,000 scholarship awarded from SABR.

THE NEGRO LEAGUES COMMITTEE (NLC) of the SOCIETY FOR AMERICAN BASEBALL RESEARCH (SABR) is pleased to announce their 2018 essay-writing contest for high school seniors. SABR is a global team of almost 6500 individuals and over 30 research committees. The NLC is the only one of SABR's committees dedicated exclusively to the history of black baseball. Each year the NLC hosts a Jerry Malloy Negro League Conference. Some initiatives of the conference include: donations of books to local schools and/or libraries, raising funds for headstones of unmarked graves and the awarding of scholarships.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Current high school senior.
- 2. Anticipating completion of high school diploma at the time of application.
- 3. Planning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. post-secondary institution.
- 4. Carrying a minimum 2.5 GPA at the end of their junior year of high school.

SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Application must be completed in full.
- 2. Your essay must be attached to your application.
- 3. Your submission must include a letter of recommendation from a high school teacher, guidance counselor or a school administrator, confirming graduation and GPA.

The Scholarship Committee of the *Jerry Malloy Negro League*Committee will review all the applications and make ONE selection. The scholarship winners will be notified byJune 7, 2021.

Students can only receive one SABR Scholarship.
