Kindergarten Screening

- Students who have participated in our preschool program have been screened for Kindergarten and will NOT need to participate in Kindergarten Screening.
- Screening helps us get to know students, place students in classes, and obtain necessary documents to complete enrollment.
- Kindergarten Screening is TENTATIVELY scheduled for August 4th and 5th, by appointment only. More information to come!

Teacher Assignments/Open House/School Supplies

- Teacher assignments and Open House information will be mailed after Kindergarten Screening in August.
- Our Open House is tentatively scheduled for Sunday, August 16th, from 2:00-3:30 (come-and-go) and is subject to change based on Missouri guidelines for COVID-19 recovery.

Positive Behavior Supports/BIST

- We work with K-1 students to develop character traits that will help them throughout life. Weekly words/phrases of the week are learned and practiced. A Code of Conduct is recited daily.
- Behavior Intervention Support Team (BIST) is used to help further practice of specific skills, traits, and behaviors for students who needs additional practice.
- Code of Conduct- "I am a bulldog. I am responsible. I am respectful. I am safe!"
- More information will be shared throughout the school year.

Assessment/Title 1

- All students in K-3 will be screened in pre-reading skills as part of a state-wide focus on indicators of reading difficulties and dyslexia.
- Our school is a Title 1 school. This means all students in our school have access to Title 1 Reading intervention, when needed. This is partially funded with federal funds.

What Kindergartners Learn- English Language Arts

- Use correct conventions when writing (print uppercase and lowercase letters, use punctuation, capitalize first and last name and beginning word in a sentence)
- Identify all uppercase and lowercase letters
- Develop phonemic awareness skills (identify letter sounds, blend sounds to make words, isolate sounds in a word, and segment words)
- Produce and distinguish between words that rhyme and do not rhyme
- Read high frequency words
- Read appropriate grade level text with purpose and understanding
- Comprehend books that are read aloud by the teacher and identify elements (character, setting)
- Compose a well-developed piece of writing through a complete sentence with correct conventions
- Listen for a purpose
- Effectively communicate

What Kindergartners Learn- Mathematics

- Read and write numbers from 0 to 20
- Represent a number of objects from 0 to 20
- Recognize, without counting, the quantity of groups up to 5 objects arranged in common patterns
- Compose and decompose numbers from 11-19 into sets of tens with additional ones
- Represent addition and subtraction within 10
- Compose and decompose numbers up to 10 in more than one way
- Demonstrate an understanding of concepts of time and devices that measure time
- Name the days of the week
- Identify pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters

Transportation

students can travel to and from school in the following ways:

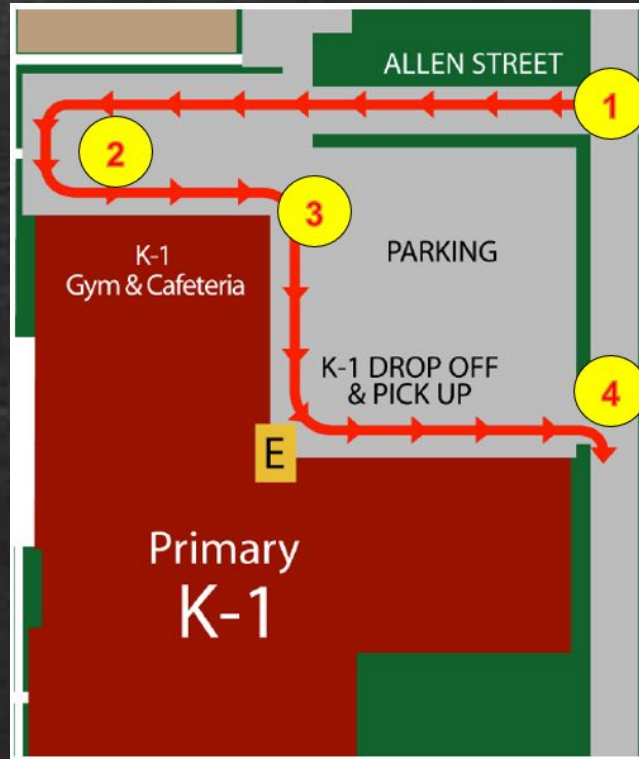
- School Bus (information at Open House)
- Learning Center (if child is enrolled in their program)
- Walker Door (for families who live close enough to walk child to the door)- located at south end of the building
- Car Line (not for walking students up to the door)- see procedures on next slide
- Y After School Program (if child is enrolled in their program- Call Joplin Family Y for more information)

Car Line Procedures

Families wishing to use our car line for morning drop-off or afternoon pick-up should review the car line procedures. Car line drop-off begins at 7:40 am. Car line pick-up begins at 3:15. Students may only exit vehicles once a full line of cars is in the loop. Cars which cannot be seen by those on duty (all the way around the loop) should not unload. A traffic attendant will dismiss the group of cars which were unloaded (or loaded after school). Please remain in the line and refrain from pulling out of the line to go around others. This helps ensure safety of our students. It helps tremendously when students can exit or enter cars on the passenger side. (See map on next slide)

1. Enter car line via Allen Street (going west)
2. Drive around the loop by the cafeteria
3. Turn right to loop around in front of the school
4. Turn right onto Roney to exit the car line
